MST is offering monthly subsidy of \$450.00

- Lessen financial burden to participants
- Subsidy per van/van group per month
- Encourage participation

Existing Commute Enterprise Vanpools within the County

- There are currently 29 vanpools in the County
- Commute Enterprise will transition participant to MST's program
- MST to capture ridership data for National Transit Data (NTD) reporting

Employers can also support their employees

- By contributing to the vanpool cost
- Attractive option for their workforce

Funding provided by the employer and/or local transit agency.

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Customized to participants needs

- Vanpool can accommodate four or more vanpoolers
- Remaining cost is split among participants
- Each rider paying set fee per month
- Choose qualifying vanpool vehicle
 - Accessible vehicles is available
 - Choose to upgrade with optional features

Commute with Enterprise Support

- Personal use allowed (may not exceed allowable miles)
- 24-hour roadside assistance
- Liability insurance
- Scheduled maintenance
- Complete clean starter kits
